CANDIDATE QUESTIONS

1. What differentiates you from your opponents for the elected office that you are seeking?

I have experience representing persons challenging discrimination which they have faced. I am open to differing viewpoints and easily communicate with a variety of people of different cultures and socio-economic backgrounds as well as persons with a range of disabilities. I work to move away from polarization to consensus.

2. Describe one issue for the district you want to represent for which you have provided leadership and about which you are passionate.

Increasing access to housing/challenging discrimination. On the Homeless Commission, I have initiated multiple housing proposals including developing a mechanism to enforce the local source of income discrimination ordinance in housing.

3. What percentage of the district you [or intend to] represent are of APA heritage?

About 20%.

Chinese, South Asian, Koreans

5. Please identify the most at-risk APA community in your district and explain why.

Immigrants because of existing biases and emerging biases that are spreading fear, mistrust and hatred, causing divisiveness; changing legal regulations that threaten stability.

1. Immigration issues; 2. Discrimination; and 3. Housing and education affordability.

7. During the COVID-19 pandemic, reports of anti-Asian verbal and physical attacks have arisen. If you are the incumbent, how have you addressed this? If you are a candidate how will you address this?

I am not an incumbent. On a personal level, I have encountered people who made xenophobic remarks against Asians and have stood up against those comments and prejudices. As a candidate/prospective office-holder, I will always stand up against any form of discrimination. I will take a position, whether as an office-holder or in my personal capacity, to not only make a symbolic declaration but to explore a means of documenting these incidents, insuring that they are properly addressed and explore means to prevent these incidents from reoccurring. I will also seek that the City provide community education and culturally competent mental health resources to provide support for survivors of racist attacks and xenophobic biases.

8. Do you believe that Asian and Pacific Americans are adequately represented in local government? What can elected officials do to improve participation?

There are two members of the Berkeley City Council that are Asian. There are Council aides that are Asian. There are also several Asian City employees. There is an Asian Rent Board member. It is important to have an inclusive environment to improve participation.

9. Please identify all Asian Pacific American candidates whom you have personally endorsed over the past 5 years including this election cycle. If there are none, please explain.

None. However, were the current Rent Board member, who is Asian, up for reelection, I would have no hesitation endorsing him and have collaborated with him on community issues. Currently, I am focusing on my own candidacy.
